Anderton Report 2014-2015

Welcome to this year's annual newsletter and report from Anderton Parish Council. In this newsletter we take a look at some of the activities that your parish council has been involved in over the previous 12 months which, together with assistance from the other local authorities of Chorley Council and Lancashire County Council, are all aimed at bring improvements to the parish and increasing the quality of life for residents.

During the course of the year we have continued our scheme of environmental improvements with remedial work undertaken on the Adlington Circular Walk at the upper part of Shawes Drive, further daffodil planting at the Millstone and Grimeford crossroads and refurbishment of roadside benches at Grimeford and on Bolton Road. We have worked jointly with our neighbouring parishes on commemoration events to mark the centenary of the First World War and we have made charitable donations to local organisations that benefit members of our community. We are also proud of the fact that we maintain one of the lowest precepts within Chorley Borough.

Roadside Bench Refurbishments

Weather and time had taken its toll on the wooden slates of the roadside bench near the Grimeford crossroads to the point where it was becoming potentially dangerous for people to use. The parish council considered the options of refurbishing the existing bench or purchasing a new replacement. We finally decided that it would be a shame to waste the existing supports so we undertook a full replacement of the slats and a repainting. We now hope the bench will have many more years of use.

Adlington Circular Walk Improvements

Towards the end of last year a number of improvements were made to the Anderton section of the Adlington Circular Walk at the upper part of Shawes Drive. These include two sections of pathway resurfacing to reduce problems caused by flooding and new gates and access improvements to the motorway bridge crossing points.

The work was carried out by the environmental organisation Groundwork Lancashire (West and Wigan) and was funded jointly between ourselves, a grant from Lottery funding and a donation from Lancashire County Council.

On Speed

The excessive speed of traffic along Bolton Road has long been of concern. Last year LCC undertook a complete traffic survey which served to highlight the problem. As a result you will have seen from time to time the deployment of a speed indicator device (or SPID) usually followed up by speed checks and enforcement measures. We ask all residents to please respect the speed limits throughout our area and help keep Anderton accident free.

First World War Commemoration

The years 2014 to 2018 mark the 100 year anniversary of the First World War. We, together with our neighbouring town and parish councils and other local organisations are working on a series of events and displays to commemorate particular anniversaries.

There have been special church services to mark the outbreak of war, a torchlight procession on the evening of armistice day and a service and library display to remember the first casualty from Adlington. We hope more will follow.

In the near future expect to see a number of specially commissioned plaques around the area acting as a visual reminder of the sacrifices made in that war.
